## WALKING IN HIS SPIRIT (Part 2)

### Luke 10:25-37

## 5. Kindness

*“But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, “And who is my neighbour?” (Luke 10:29)*

There is a parlance that says, “A friend in need is a friend indeed”.

The story of the Good Samaritan, which we must have heard and read over and over, is a perfect illustration of what goodness is all about. The Good Samaritan and the armed robbery victim belong to two different boundaries. However, the Good Samaritan dared to go beyond the ethnic, religious and social borders to lend a helping hand at the risk of being ostracised from his own community. These are the underlying elements that make this story a unique story of an act of kindness.

The Samaritan, that is, is the one who recognises that when it comes to the question of who is our neighbour, there are no rules, either cultural or religious. Our neighbour, it turns out, is anyone in need. Where does such vision come from? It apparently does not come from one's ethnicity, one's religion, one's training or one's station in life.

The Jews typically interpreted “neighbour” meaning “one who is near,” in terms of members of the same people and religious community, that is, fellow Jews (as in Lev. 19:18; Mt. 5:43-48). The Pharisees tended to exclude “ordinary people” from their definition.

The lawyer that came to ask Jesus questions agreed that the main essence of the Law is to love one's neighbour as oneself, but then seeks to limit the application of this to fellow Jews. His second motive was to defend his own limited interpretation of the Law. This is a rabbi or scholar struggling with integrity between his beliefs and actions.

Jesus replied the lawyer by telling him the story of the Good Samaritan. A Priest, a Levite and the hearers would be expecting a Jewish layman to be the third and climatic character. Three people or situations are often found in stories of that period (Mt. 25:14-30; Lk. 19:11-27; 14:18-20; 20:10-12).

But, no! Jesus introduces a Samaritan into the story.

The Samaritans were particularly hated in Jesus' day. They lived in an area South of Galilee and North of Judea, part of the Old Kingdom of Israel.

In 721BC, Israel was conquered by Assyria, and Sargon II carried out a mass deportation of the entire region, carrying off some 27,270 captives and resettling the area with colonists from other parts of the Assyrian Empire (2 Kgs. 17:24). Their descendants were looked upon as half-breeds and heretics by the Jews of Jerusalem. Though Samaritans believed in the Torah,

they worshipped at Mt. Gerizim rather than Jerusalem (Jn. 4:20-22). At times relations between the mainstream Jews, as it were, and Samaritans had been civil, but in Jesus' day feelings were definitely hostile.

For Jesus to introduce the Samaritan as the caring person, after a Priest and a Levite had neglected mercy, must have been intended as an especially biting statement on what passed for "mercy" among the pillars of Judaism.

The lawyer began by asking for a definition of "neighbor" in order to justify limiting his love to his fellow Jews only. Jesus does not define "neighbor" in so many words, but his story makes it clear that our neighbor is whoever has a great need. It does not matter who they are. Jesus's command to love our neighbor as ourselves knows no self gratifying boundaries.
