PENTECOST SUNDAY

Today is Pentecost Sunday and it is usually celebrated as or marks the birthday of the Church. It is also referred to as Whit Sunday. It marks the day when there was an outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the disciples of Jesus. The event transformed their lives such that they were then fearlessly able to proclaim the message of Jesus. This outpouring of the Holy Spirit was in fulfilment of Jesus' injunction to the disciples to wait in Jerusalem till they had been filled with power from on high. Their task of proclaiming the Gospel would, it seems, have been otherwise impossible.

Yet, the promise of the Holy Spirit was not something new. The prophet Joel had also talked about a moment in history, "in the latter days", when what had been the preserve of a few individuals, would now become a common gift. In the OT, God's Spirit was given to selected people to enable them accomplish His purpose. God's Holy Spirit distinguished them, set them apart, energised them such that they were able to do exploits for the Lord. What Joel prophesied that at that moment, all would receive this power.

In the OT, the Holy Spirit is referred to as the power, the 'ruah' of God, hence it was imperative for all whom the Lord would choose for whatever special assignment, to first be filled with this power. Our understanding of the Holy Spirit is incomplete without the link to 'the Beginning' when God's 'ruah' hovered above the formless deep. The sense therefore of God's Spirit, present at creation is naturally carried into the NT, where the Holy Spirit becomes the agent of re-creation.

It would be impossible to give a full theological write up about the Holy Spirit in the space available. In fact, Jesus warns us in John's Gospel, that 'the Spirit will lead us into all truth.' There is the sense therefore that not all that can be written about the Holy Spirit has been written or will ever be. Some refer to the Book of Acts as 'Acts of the Holy Spirit', which was an attempt to highlight some, not all events that took place from the day of Pentecost as the Church spread, for Jerusalem to Samaria and to the ends of the earth. The 'Acts' describe events that happened over a twenty five year period, in twenty five chapters!

Here in the Cathedral, we celebrate that first Pentecost as we present candidates to our Archbishop for confirmation. The rite of confirmation affords all candidates the opportunity to reaffirm vows earlier made at their baptism. This is particularly true for those who were baptised as infants. Confirmation also provides the opportunity for the candidates to receive, in increasing measure, another impartation of the Holy Spirit, through the laying on of hands. However, it is important for them and us, to realise that even on a daily basis, the Holy Spirit can be given to us so that we really can be filled with the Holy Spirit to do God's work and live the life He wants for us.

In reflecting on the importance of this day to the Church and the many important theological themes and consequences for the Church, particularly as it concerns the life of God's universal Church and our Cathedral in particular, one cannot but help reflecting on an aspect of the event itself as opposed to the consequences of the event for the disciples.

The NIV translation of the Bible sets the scene of the day of Pentecost this way: "when the day of Pentecost came, **they were all together in one place.**" Some other translations render the "**all together**" as "**in one accord**" and I think that this is very important, for to me it conveys the idea of unity and of a common expectation. It seems to suggest that their togetherness in prayer (very important in Luke/Acts understanding for the giving of the Spirit) made the atmosphere conducive for the coming or fulfilment of the promise of the Holy Spirit.


That unity of purpose and togetherness is so important I believe, not only for God's Holy Spirit to come to us, but it is also vital for the Spirit's abiding presence and work among us. Later Paul will dwell on the theme of the Spirit as the agent of unity. No wonder, the events of Pentecost were not a mere fulfilling of a promise, but a miracle. It was a deliberate act of God, reversing the confusion of *Genesis 11* with an understanding of each other in spite of our differences in language or culture through the agency of the Holy Spirit.

My prayer as we celebrate the birth of the Church today is that God will on a daily basis, fill us with His Holy Spirit that we may do exploits for Him. May our Cathedral continue to experience God's peace that passeth all understanding such that God's presence in the power of the Holy Spirit will forever abide with us.

"Spirit divine attend our prayers and make this house thy home, descend with all thy gracious powers, o come great Spirit come"! Amen.

Bible Study Outline

Theme: Growing in the Grace and Knowledge of God

Topic: Abuse of God's Grace (vii) Selfishness

Text: Luke 16: 19-31

Aim: To teach that the grace of God in our lives should be extended to our neighbours.

INTRODUCTION:

What do we have that had not been given to us from heaven? We, as children of God, should, therefore, see whatever we have, whatever position we occupy and whoever we are, as a special grace from above. The rich man in our text today refused to see his wealth as a gift of God. Therefore, he abused the grace of God by failing to cater for the poor neighbours around him. God hates the selfish man, ... 1:10, no wonder, the rich man ended up in hell after death.
