# Bible Study Outline

**Theme: Growing in the Grace and Knowledge of God.**

**Topic: Abuse of God's Grace (viii) Oppression of the poor**

**Text: Deut. 24: 10-15**

**Aim: To teach that we should not use our positions and wealth to oppress the less privileged.**

## **INTRODUCTION:**

In our text today, we are made to know that a lot of less privileged people may come to us for help. If it will mean to lend such people anything, force or violence must not be used as a means to retrieve what was borrowed from us. If we find out that what was lent was important to him and taking back his pledge may be dangerous to his health, we should not take such back with violence. Also, we should not use our position to delay the payment of our worker's wages.

## **QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION**

- 1 What do you understand by oppression? Deut. 24: 17; Mal. 3:5; Exd. 23:9, Psalm 94:6.
2. What is God advising us here to do concerning the less privileged who approach us for one help or the other? Deut. 24: 12-13; Prov. 14:31; Psalm 82:3,4.
3. What is God's judgment for the oppressor of the poor in Amos 2:6,8,13.1; Amos 5:11; Matt. 25:42-46.
4. Name some of the ways by which the rich oppress the poor among us today. Amos 2:6; 4:1; Psalm 10:2.
5. What is the reward of those who cater for the poor? Prov. 14:21; Prov. 22:9; Deut. 15:9-10; Psalm 41:1; Acts 20:35.

**CONCLUSION:** We should always remember that our present position and pleasure is temporal, but whatever we do to alleviate the hardship of the poor is eternal and rewarding.

# SOUL FOOD 25/2011

## TRINITY SUNDAY

At the Alfa Conference last week, the story was told of a polygamist from East Africa, who attended an Alfa Course together with two of his wives at the instance of the first wife, who had already attend an earlier course. After the first meeting, when asked what he thought of the course, he replied that he had received new insight as to how to see his three wives; "from now on" he said, "I will see all three as one!".

I guess to most of us, this man's view is nothing more than a joke or mere wishful thinking, for even if he saw all three as one, we can be most certain that the women would not share his view, or would they?.

Today being Trinity Sunday, we are being called upon to reconsider or celebrate the unity in the God head or perhaps, the revelation of God as Father and author of creation - as Son in our redemption - and as Spirit in our santification - the doctrine of the three persons in one God. To reaffirm (like the polygamist) that all three - Father, Son and Holy Spirit are one!

I use the word 'reconsider' perhaps because I am aware that one of the difficulties we face as christians particularly when we evangelise, is to show or prove to non believers that we worship One God - though manifested in three persons. None believers will accuse us if being polytheistic; whilst we maintain that our religion is monotheistic.

Many parts of our scripture of course teach us or are interpreted as proof of the unity of the God head. In Genesis, we hear of the "let us create man in our image in our likeness...." *In John's Gospel 14:5-17*, Jesus assures us of this unity between himself the Father and the Spirit.

Many philosophical and scientific attempts have been and continue to be made to describe or articulate the doctrine of the Trinity. My favorite is an appeal to chemistry and to the chemical composition of water, which is H<sub>2</sub>O - and no matter what form it appears whether as liquid, ice or vapour - it is still H<sub>2</sub>O. Philosophically we might question whether or not there is a difference between our thinking,

our speaking or our actions. This argument is partly articulated by John's prologue (John 1:1-14).

Then perhaps what might be the best, is simply to believe. Believe that the God of Creation is the author of our redemption and our Sanctifier. This is an appeal to an understanding of the doctrine from the point of view of the Divine revelation through God's operation in our human experience.

Whatever works best for each of us, we must not forget one of the main thrusts of this doctrine which is central to our faith - and that is the unity of the Godhead; for therein we are challenged to share a unity, not only with the Godhead, but with each other. It is then that we could be said to really be created in the image of God; particularly when we share in that unity with each other. When we are in disunity - that image of God, which we share, becomes distorted or blurred - like that of a photograph taken that is out of focus.


Nicky Gumble, Vicar of Holy Trinity Brompton, London emphasised this point thus "Our differences in the body of Christ must not divide us but lead us to realise how much more we need each other".

May we as a Church and as families continue to enjoy the unity that mirrors that of the God head. Amen.
