# Bible Study Outline

**Theme:** Growing in the Grace and Knowledge of God

**Topic:** Abuse of God's Grace (vi) Covetousness

## INTRODUCTION:

It was by the grace of God that the Israelites defeated the city of Jericho. (Joshua 6:20). This special grace was misused by Achan, one of the Israelites. This resulted in the defeat of the Israelites by a country considerably smaller than Jericho. (Joshua 7: 1,5). Joshua inquired from the Lord and he was told that the defeat was caused by Achan's covetousness. He was therefore stoned to death.

## WALKING IN HIS SPIRIT (Part 2)

### The Fruit of the Spirit

#### 1. Love

*"Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth."  
- 1 John 3:18.*

Today, we are continuing with our series on the Holy Spirit. The topic is divided into two parts because of its importance to our Christian life. In the first part, we dealt with the nature or person of the Holy Spirit, His work, How to be filled with Him and the need for us to cooperate with Him in order for Him to lead us on our daily and heavenward journey.

In this second part, we shall be looking at **'The Fruit of the Spirit.'** It will not be in the usual way of mentioning them in passing in one sermon or lecture. We intend to, devote more time to studying the Fruit of the Spirit as this is the main essence of being filled with the Holy Spirit. They are the qualities that will distinguish us as children of the light in this dark world. They are also the yardsticks for us to measure the genuineness of our relationship with God and fellow human beings. Any child who lacks any of these characteristics that mark a true believer will need to re-examine his or her calling so that he or she will not put his or her eternity into jeopardy. No other reference in the scriptures paints a vivid contrast between the lifestyle of the spirit-filled Christian and that of the human carnal nature than **Galatians 5:16-26**. St. Paul not only points out the general difference in lifestyles by emphasizing that the Spirit and the flesh are opposed to each other, but he ends with a specific list both of the works of the flesh and of the Fruit of the Spirit.

Our major concern out of the two lists is that of the **"Fruit of the Spirit."** This is produced in God's children as they allow the Spirit to so control and influence their thoughts, words and actions that they demolish the power of sin, especially the works of the flesh, and walk in fellowship with God. **(Rom 8: 5-14)**. According to the list, the first of the Fruit of the Spirit is **LOVE**.

Love has been described and expressed variously by different people both In the sacred (the Bible)

and in the secular. The following descriptions will definitely highlight the important facts or truths which we need to know or reflect upon and we shall do well to retain them in our minds.


Love is caring and seeking for the highest good of another person without any motive for personal gain (**Rom. 5:5; 1 Cor. 13; Eph. 5:2; Col. 3:14**).

Love is love, either you love someone or you don't. If there are strings attached, it is not love. Love is when you care about someone more than you care about yourself. It goes beyond that, too, but I think that is at least a real evidence that you love someone.

Love is a way of interacting in a caring way with other people. Unconditional love means you don't predicate your caring on the other person's performance. An example would be parents who continue to care for their children even after they have screwed up. A typical example here is that of St. Augustine and his mother - Monica. Monica did not give up on her erring son. She prayed and supported him until he was saved. God demonstrated His love for mankind by sending His only and beloved Son to die for our sins. He was humiliated, mocked and killed, yet His love for us did not wane. For the unloved, lonely and sinners, come to Him today and you will begin to experience His love in a special way. For those who have received His love in one way or the other, you need to share with others the gift you have received so that our world will become a lovely and better place.
