ANGLICANISM FAST FACTS

39 ARTICLES OF RELIGION ARTICLE XXXVII

37. The State and its Civil Representatives

The power of the Civil Magistrate extends to all men, as well as Clergy as Laity, in all things temporal; but has no authority in things purely spiritual. And we hold it to be the duty of all men who are professors of the Gospel, to pay respectful obedience to the Civil authority, regularly and legitimately constituted. The original 1571, 1662 text of this article reads as follows: The sovereign has the chief power in the realm of England and his other possessions. The supreme government of all in this realm, whatever their station, whether ecclesiastical or civil, and in all matters, belongs to him and is not, nor ought to be, subject to any foreign jurisdiction. When we attribute to the sovereign the chief government (a title which seems to have offended some slanderous persons) we do not grant our rulers the ministry of either God's Word or of the sacraments. This is also made clear in the Injunctions published by Queen Elizabeth I. By this we acknowledge only the prerogative which we see in Holy Scripture God has given to all godly rulers. They should rule all people committed to their charge by God, whatever their station or rank, whether ecclesiastical or secular, and restrain with the civil power those who are stubborn or practice evil. The bishop of Rome has no jurisdiction in this realm of England. The laws of the realm may punish Christian people with death for heinous and grave offenses. It is lawful for Christian men at the command of the state to carry weapons and serve in wars.

RECEIVING GOD'S GUIDANCE FOR POSSIBILITIES THROUGH (v) Witnessing

"And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. We are therefore Christ's ambassadors..." 2 Corinthians 5:19&20.

God's guidance as we know involves offering direction, clarity, and support, leading to better decision-making, personal growth, and ultimately, a more fulfilling and purposeful life. Jesus' many invitations demonstrate that a relationship with the Lord arms individuals with needed tools, knowledge, and support to navigate life's challenges and opportunities. For instance, in Matthew 11:28-30, He invites the weary and burdened to come to Him for rest and to learn from Him the secret of a meaningful and impactful existence. He says: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

To help humanity connect with Him, Jesus gave the Great Commission before His Ascension. He directed thus: "Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19-20) In essence, He instructed His disciples to spread the Gospel worldwide as witnesses to His life-changing and life-guiding power, and thereby instituted the practice of Witnessing in Christian Theology, as a means of fulfilling His mandate to share the message of salvation and to invite others to experience the grace, forgiveness, and love that comes through a personal relationship with Him. Paul reminds us: "And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. We are therefore Christ's ambassadors..." (2Corinthians 5:19&20)

Jonah Chapter 3 is an account of the interconnectedness of human choices and God's response, it emphasises God's desire for reconciliation and the salvation of all people. Despite initially running away from his mission to tell Gentiles about God's impending judgement, Jonah ended up witnessing to both the sailors he encountered while fleeing and the city of Nineveh, to which he was sent. Jonah's witness in Nineveh led to a remarkable transformation within the city. The people of the city made a deliberate effort to change their behaviour and turn away from violence and

wickedness. They embraced a newfound commitment to righteousness and ethical living. Jonah's witness guided them to God's rich mercy and love.

I am led to press home this theme using a two-prong approach, one addressing a Christian witness and two, speaking to individuals wanting to benefit from the guidance provided by Witnessing. As Christian witnesses, we must understand the basics of Witnessing to offer guidance to those we minister to. Throughout history, Christians have shared their faith and understanding of the Bible to guide people in their spiritual journeys and interactions with the world. This takes various forms, including verbal communication of the Gospel, distributing literature, engaging in conversations, and using multiple media platforms. But Witnessing is not just about proclaiming the message, it is also a demonstration of Christ's love through acts of service, kindness, and social justice efforts. In other words, caring and compassion must go hand in hand with Witnessing.

To be effective in Witnessing, the attitude of a faithful Christian witness should be characterised by a combination of humility, love, authenticity, and a sincere desire to share the message of the Gospel. Humility acknowledges that the transformation and impact that accompany Witnessing come from the power of the Gospel and the work of the Holy Spirit, rather than from their own efforts. Jesus assures in Acts 1:8, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Another requirement is living in accordance with Jesus Christ's teachings. This strengthens the authenticity of the message we spread. Also, genuine Christian witness must also be displayed through actions, not just words, sharing our faith with enthusiasm and joy. The hope and transformation that result from a relationship with Christ should be evident in our demeanour and words, reflecting a sense of joy that others may want to experience as well. We also need empathy to personally connect, understand others' struggles and joys, and provide the desired support.

On the other hand, benefiting from Christian witnessing involves being open to the message of the Gospel and engaging with the testimonies and teachings of those who share their faith. As individuals in need of guidance, we must be open to wisdom provided through Witnessing to be guided in making informed choices and find direction and purpose in life that will usher us into the realm of unstoppable miracles. Isaiah teaches: "How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him that bring good news, that publish peace." (Isa. 52:7) The good news of God's truth brings hope, peace, and spiritual prosperity to the beleaguered places and people in the world.

Today, I urge you to make use of the guidance offered by Witnessing, regardless of your background and situation. Paul firmly states, "Whoever believes in him will never be put to shame." There is no distinction between Jew and Gentile, as the same Lord blesses all who call upon him. "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." (Romans 10:11-13)
