THEME: THE CHRISTIAN RACE

**SUB-THEME:** GENERAL CONCEPT OF RACE 1

Topic: Earthly Race Text: I Cor. 9:24-27

**AIMS** 

(i) to introduce the year's Theme in the context of earthly race and

(ii) to help us understand the Christian race in the context of earthly race.

#### **INTRODUCTION**

Earthly race is simply a competition between two or more persons or Teams that starts and ends on earth. It can be athletic like running, games like football, or competition like Boxing. In our text today, Apostle Paul analysed the earthly Olympic Games by the Roman athletes. He emphasised on the disciplined habits in all aspects of life (ICor 9: 25, v27). Like earthly participants, Christians on the heavenly race are also admonished to live discipline lives in order to win the imperishable crown of life. Throughout this year, we shall study all it takes to run our race on earth towards the kingdom of God. It is our prayer that as we study together this year, we shall all end the year with abundant spiritual riches in Jesus name.

#### 12. Good Works

Although good works, which are the fruits of faith and follow on after justification, can never atone for our sins or face the strict justice of God's judgment, they are nevertheless pleasing and acceptable to God in Christ and necessarily spring from a true and living faith. Thus a living faith is as plainly known by its good works as a tree is known by its fruit.

#### 13. Works Before Justification

Works done before receiving the grace of Christ and the inspiration of his Spirit are not pleasing to God. This is because they do not spring out of faith in Jesus Christ. Nor do they make people fit to receive grace or (as the schoolmen say) to deserve grace of congruity. On the contrary, because they are not done as God has willed and commanded that they should be done, it is undoubtedly the case that they have the nature of sin.

"...and the master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine. He did not realise where it had come from, though the servants who had drawn the water knew. Then he called the bridegroom aside and said, "Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you have saved the best till now." John 2:9&10

In Christian theology, Jesus Christ is not just the Saviour, He is also the Restorer – the holy and only one who brings back what was lost, mends what is broken, and heals what is wounded. According to Scripture, one of the primary roles of Jesus Christ is to restore humanity's broken relationship with God. He achieved this through His life, death, and resurrection. He reconciles humanity with God, overcoming the separation caused by sin. Jesus had a mission of restoring not just God-man relationship, but also social systems, to rebuild broken communities, reconcile estranged groups, and establishing justice and peace. He did this by challenging social norms, showing compassion to marginalized groups, and preaching a message of love, forgiveness, and justice.

In addition, His earthly ministry is also marked by acts of healing and restoration. He heals the sick, restores sight to the blind, and even brings the dead back to life. In other words, Jesus Christ as the Restorer is a theme that encapsulates the essence of His mission and its impact on individuals and the world – that is, reconciliation, healing, transformation, and the ultimate renewal of all things. Hence, the theme – "The Difference He Makes" examines this impact to bring us nearer to our restoration this year.

The story of Jesus turning water into wine, as told in John 2:1-11, is the first of 35 recorded miracles that Jesus performed. This miracle was a revelation of Jesus' mastery of quality. At a wedding ceremony, Jesus turned water into the "choicest wine" or "best wine" in an instant, which amazed the people who witnessed it. The master of the banquet, who did not know the source of the wine, was pleasantly surprised by its quality. The transformation of water into wine symbolises the new joy and fulfilment that Jesus brings with His ministry. It is a sign of the abundance and quality of His blessings, emphasising the difference that Jesus makes whenever and wherever He is present as the Restorer.

Jesus' mission, described in Luke 4:18, addresses physical, spiritual, and social needs. It reads: "The Spirit of the Lord is on me because He has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free." In this manifesto, Jesus – the Restorer, promises full restoration to the captives and the oppressed, the blind, and the poor. In concrete terms, Jesus is the source of peace, clarity, and hope. He is the answer to our prayers and helps us in difficult situations because he understands our pain. Hebrews 4:15 tells us: "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathise with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are - yet He did not sin." Christ has a unique understanding of our plight (Hebrews 2:18).

However, there are keys to benefitting from all Jesus Christ has to offer as the Restorer. First is always to keep our eyes on Jesus. When the Apostle Peter walked on the water, in direct obedience to the Lord's command to do so, he sank into the Sea of Galilee when he saw the blowing winds, pounding rain and tempest of the waves. (Mattew 14:29ff) Peter's mistake was not looking at the storm; it was taking his eyes off Jesus. Our problem as Christians is not that we focus on our problems, difficulties, and distractions in life but rather that we take our eyes off Jesus. Mary fixed her eyes on Jesus and brought the couple's problem to Him. Rather than fussing about it, she directed their attention to Christ. Jesus' invitation to the burdened and the weary to come to Him in Matthew is a testament that He can restore all situations.

Second, we need absolute obedience and faith to encounter the difference He makes. Scripturally, faith and obedience are two sides of the same coin, with both being essential in the process of restoration. Faith

is the deep trust and confidence in God and His promises, while obedience is the active response to that faith, leading to and manifesting restoration in various forms. At the wedding in Cana of Galilee, the servants' faith and obedience play a crucial role in restoring the wine supply. Their obedience in filling the jars with water and then drawing from them as instructed by Jesus, without understanding the outcome, demonstrates faith and obedience. "Do whatever he tells you." The statement made by Mary, His Mother, in John 2:5. is an invitation to faith and obedience.

The message that I want to convey is that Jesus promises to make everything right, regardless of the horrible things that have happened or are happening in our lives. In Christ, we are on the winning side, and no matter what tribulations, struggles, sins, failures, losses, heartaches, or hardships we may be facing, Jesus can make a difference. Apostle Paul describes the completeness and abundance we have in Christ when he said: "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ." (Ephesians 1:2)

I pray that nothing will ever come between us and our Restorer – Jesus Christ, for Him to make the best out of our lives.
