Bible Study Outline

THEME: THE CHRISTIAN RACE

SUB-THEME: GENERAL CONCEPT OF RACE 3

TOPIC: Nature of Earthly Race 2 – Focus on Vain Glory

TEXT: Esther 3:1-15

AIMS:

i. to study the concept of vain glory and

ii. to discuss the banes of vain glory on our Christian race to eternal life.

INTRODUCTION

In earthly race, the invitation for medal presentation to winners is the height of such events. Yet, they, are all forgotten within short time especially after the demise of the winner; thereby making the short-term glorification a vanity. Vainglory is the sin or vice of someone that immoderately desires renown, prestige, or the praise and respect of others. The desire of these things is not necessarily sinful, but becomes so when it is immoderate and disordered. Haman was a man that always seeks self-glorification. This bad focus led him into evil competition with Mordecai.

STUDY GUIDES

CONCLUSION: If all kinds of efforts and strictest discipline are invested to obtain medals for earthly races, but yet, they are perishable, corruptible and with vain satisfaction; Christians must run their race to eternal life with all diligence for the imperishable, incorruptible, and eternal glory.

14. Works of Supererogation

The concept of voluntary works besides, over and above God's commandments, which are sometime called works of supererogation, cannot be taught without arrogance and impiety. By them men do declare not only that they render to God their proper duty but that they actually do more than their duty. But Christ says: 'So you also, when you after done everything you were told to do, should say, "We are unprofitable servants."

15. Of Christ Alone Without Sin

Christ, who truly took our human nature, was made like us in every respect except that of sin. From this he was clearly free in both body and spirit. He came to be the Lamb without blemish who, by the sacrifice of himself once made, should take away the sins of the world. Sin, as St. John says, was not in him. But all the rest of us, even though baptized and born again in Christ, still offend in many ways. If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.

(iii)Know His Way

"I thought, "These are only the poor; they are foolish, for they do not know the way of the Lord, the requirements of their God. So, I will go to the leaders and speak to them; surely, they know the way of the Lord, the requirements of their God." But with one accord, they, too, had broken off the yoke and torn off the bonds." Jeremiah 5:4&5

Gaining information or knowledge about something is called "knowing," while "knowledge" denotes familiarity with something due to experience or association. After discovering specific facts about Jesus Christ, the Restorer, such as His ability to make a significant difference and His willingness to offer help, endeavouring to understand Him and His way more is prudent. This knowledge helps us draw closer to Him and achieve our desired restoration.

The Way of the Lord is a recurring theme in Scripture, particularly the Old Testament. Knowing the Lord and His way is vital to experiencing God's favour. God, through Moses, instructed the Israelites to keep God's commandments by walking in His way. "You shall walk in all the way that the Lord your God has commanded you, that you may live, and that it may go well with you, and that you may live long in the land that you shall possess." (Deuteronomy 5:33) Knowing the way of the Lord is an essential precursor to walking in it. It may be difficult for someone to walk in a way they do not know.

In Jeremiah 5, the prophet describes the condition of Jerusalem and Judah, highlighting the prevalent corruption and the failure of people to follow the way of the Lord. At first, the prophet believed that the poor and uneducated did not understand God's ways, which could be excused because of their circumstances. However, as he continued to observe, he realised that even the wealthy and powerful, who should have known better, also failed to abide by God's laws. Consequently, the Lord allowed the enemies to plunder them. In verse 6, the prophecy says: "Therefore, a lion from the forest will attack them, a wolf from the desert will ravage them, a leopard will lie in wait near their towns to tear to pieces any who venture out, for their rebellion is great and their backslidings many." This prophecy underscores the painful and unpleasant outcome of denying or living obliviously to the way of the Lord.

The theme we are considering invites us to know the Lord's way. The Hebrew word "derekh" refers to a physical road, but it is often used as a metaphor for the ethical course of an individual's life. In the context of the theme, the "way of the Lord" refers to the life modelled by Jesus Christ, which is the path to the presence of God - the intimate presence of God which offers irreversible restoration.

Jesus' teachings in Matthew 5:1-12, known as the Beatitudes of the Sermon on the Mount, are seen as the way of the Lord in that they provide a moral and ethical framework that reflects the values of the Kingdom of Heaven. They emphasise the blessedness of those who discover and embrace His way. Jesus says: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for they shall inherit the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be filled. Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the sons of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

According to the Beatitudes, the way of the Lord consists in total deference to God for sustenance while recognising our spiritual poverty and our need for God. It also involves extending comfort to those who suffer loss and hardships with utmost humility and gentleness without arrogating anything to ourselves. It emphasises a deep desire for justice and moral righteousness, the importance of showing compassion to others and the value of resolving conflicts and fostering peace. It entails purity of heart, often associated with sincerity, integrity, and a singular focus on God, even when we face oppression and suffering for our moral choices and actions.

For Christians, understanding the Beatitudes is knowing the Lord's way. Even though they are intricate and challenging to abide by, they are also incredibly beautiful. They portray a way of life that goes beyond mere adherence to rules and laws, encompassing a set of standards, callings, and attitudes. This is what it truly means to live like Christ.

To lead a life that attracts full restoration, we must embrace the demanding realm of the Beatitudes. David would passionately cry to God: "Teach me your way, O Lord, and lead me on a level path because of my enemies" (Psalm 27:11). "Make me know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths" (Psalm 25:4). This should be our utmost desire as we seek complete restoration this year. Like the Psalmist, we should pray daily to the Lord to teach us His way so we may not depart from it. He promised to guide us in Isaiah: "And your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying, "This is the way, walk in it," when you turn to the right or when you turn to the left." (Isaiah 30:21) We should take to heart the call of the reference verse to contemplate our understanding and adherence to God's ways.

Let us embrace the challenge to deepen our knowledge of God, not merely intellectually but in how we live out His commands each day. Moses said: "Now therefore, if I have found favour in your sight, please show me now your ways, that I may know you in order to find favour in your sight." (Exodus 33:13) Without understanding the Lord and His ways, the desired restoration may remain elusive. Proverbs 14:12 says, "There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way to death." Only the way of the Lord leads to the fullness of life
