ARTICLE XVII

#### 17. Predestination and Election

Predestination to life is the eternal purpose of God, whereby (before the foundations of the world were laid) he has consistently decreed by his counsel which is hidden from us to deliver from curse and damnation those whom he has chosen in Christ out of mankind and to bring them through Christ to eternal salvation as vessels made for honor. Hence those granted such an excellent benefit by God are called according to God's purpose by his Spirit working at the appropriate time. By grace they obey the calling; they are freely justified, are made sons of God by adoption, are made like the image of his only-begotten Son Jesus Christ, they walk faithfully in good works and at the last by God's mercy attain eternal happiness. The reverent consideration of this subject of predestination and of our election in Christ is full of sweet, pleasant, and inexpressible comfort to the godly and to those who feel within themselves the working of the Spirit of Christ, putting to death the deeds of the sinful and earthly nature and lifting their minds up to high and heavenly things. This consideration establishes and confirms their belief in the eternal salvation o be enjoyed through Christ and kindles a fervent love towards God. But for inquisitive and unspiritual persons who lack the Spirit of Christ to have thesentence of God's predestination continually before their eyes is a dangerous snare which the deviluses to drive them either into desperation or into recklessly immoral living (a state no less perilous than desperation). Furthermore we need to receive God's promises in the manner in which they are generally set out to us in Holy Scripture, and in our actions we need to follow that will of God which is clearly declared to us in the Word of God.

Mar.29 The foundation Stone of the new Christ Church was laid by His Excellency, John Hawley Glover, afterwards Sir John, the Administrator of the colony of Lagos, in the presence of James A. Lamb (Minister), and Henry Doherty Esq. and John Ogunbunmi Esq. (Wardens)

1871

Mar.12 The first Ordination Service was held in the uncompleted Church by Bishop Samuel Ajayi Crowther. Three deacons, including his son Dandeson C. Crowther were ordained.

1906

The conference of Anglican Bishops in Lagos passed a resolution for the inauguration of the March Province of West Africa.

A constitution was adopted for the new Diocese, and Dr. Henry Carr. MA., B.C.L, the Inspector of Education in the colonial government was appointed the first Chancellor of the new Diocese.

# POSITIONING OURSELVES FOR FULL RESTORATION

# (iii)Self Denial and Cross Bearing

"Then He said to them all: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me." - Luke 9:23

This week's meditation theme centres on the concepts of Self-denial and Cross-bearing as taught by Jesus Christ in the Synoptic Gospels. The goal is to explore how these practices can help us develop spiritually and enjoy more of God's blessings. Although self-denial and cross-bearing are often thought of as two sides of the same coin, it is essential to define each concept separately to avoid confusion.

Self-denial for the Christian means renouncing oneself as the centre of existence and recognising Jesus Christ as one's new and true centre. It means acknowledging that the old self is dead, and the new life is now hidden with Christ in God (see Colossians 3:3–5). It involves overcoming the persistent fleshly demands of the body, also known as the carnal self or the natural man and bringing them into submission to God's Word so that we do not give in to sin. Scripture says: "And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires" (Galatians 5:24).

On the flip side of the coin is Jesus' command to take up one's own cross. This has some fundamental similarities to self-denial in the sense that cross-bearing also involves going against the natural tendencies we might have. A cross is anything contrary to our will or our nature. While this is a companion to self-denial, it raises the bar in terms of what it requires of us. According to Luke, the cross represents someone others denounced for their actions, values, or identity in Jesus Christ and mainly consists of suffering to identify with Him. Philippians 1:29 states, "For it has been granted to you on behalf of Christ not only to believe in Him but also to suffer for Him."

The story of Joseph in Genesis 39 is a powerful demonstration of self-denial and cross-bearing. Despite being far away from his home and holding a position of power in Potiphar's household, Joseph faced a problematic moral test when Potiphar's wife attempted to seduce him. In this trying moment, Joseph demonstrated his unwavering commitment to integrity and faithfulness, not just to his master Potiphar but to God. By resisting the temptation and choosing the path of self-denial, Joseph set an inspiring example for all of us. His story reminds us that true strength and character come not from yielding to temptation but standing firm in our convictions, even when the cost is high. "How then could I do such a wicked thing and sin against God?" (Genesis 39:9). His rejection of Mrs. Potiphar's advances, despite the possible benefits of complying and the risks of refusal, highlights his fear of God over human judgment or desire.

While the practices of self-denial and cross-bearing might seem daunting, they offer profound benefits across various aspects of life. By embracing these disciplines, individuals can experience complete restoration. Joseph's choice leads to false accusations from Potiphar's wife and his subsequent imprisonment, showcasing the often complex and sacrificial path that self-denial can entail. However, his faithfulness and integrity are later rewarded, as his ability to interpret dreams leads him out of prison and to a position of power that enables him to save Egypt and his family from famine.

The Apostle Paul's life and teachings are profound examples of self-denial and cross-bearing in the New Testament. In his letters, he frequently spoke about dying to the self and living for Christ. For instance, Galatians

2:20 states, "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Him."

Our Master, Jesus demonstrated self-denial and cross-bearing in His earthly life to leave us an example. The King of kings became the suffering servant of all, as prophesied in Isaiah 53. The Owner of the universe became a wretch to please His Father. He was hated, insulted, and persecuted for doing what was right. He said in John 15:20, "A servant is not greater than his master. If they persecuted me, they would persecute you".

Following Jesus and trusting Him for full restoration can be challenging, as He never promised an easy life for His followers. Instead, He warned us that we may face suffering for His sake. However, if we stay committed to Him until the end, we will gain eternal life and countless blessings. Losing our life for Christ's sake is gaining, something the world cannot comprehend. Jesus said in Matthew 16:25-26, "For those who try to save their life will lose it, but those who lose their life for My sake will find it. For what profit is it to a person if they gain the whole world but lose their own soul? Or what will a person give in exchange for their soul?" Therefore, following Christ should mean everything to us, and not even the threat of death can rob us of the glory that awaits us.
