**THEME: GOD'S CHILDREN AS PILGRIMS TO THE HEAVENLY KINGDOM:
MANIFESTATION OF GOD'S REIGN ON EARTH**

SUB-THEME: Dangers on the path of Pilgrims to heavenly Kingdom 9

TOPIC: Remiss

TEXT: Luk 21:29-38

AIMS:

- i. to define remiss from the biblical and Christian point of view*
- ii. to see how it can affect the eternal destiny of a pilgrim on the Kingdom path.*

INTRODUCTION

Today, we shall be discussing a very terrible danger that may not be prominent, but at the same time very dangerous on the path of Pilgrims to heavenly Kingdom. It is Remiss. To be remiss simply means lacking care or attention to duty. It is a negligent attitude to important things. Some Biblical heroes that fell off the track of obtaining the glorious crown missed it because they are remiss. Our Text today exposed us to the importance Jesus attached to the Fig season and thereby compared it to His second coming. Carelessness to observe these will easily make one miss out on the Lord's second coming.

STUDY GUIDE

1. Define Remiss according to our introduction.
2. Analyse how Eli the priest became a victim of remiss. 1Sam 2:22-24, 3:16-18, 4:16-18. Relate this to a Christian home.
3. Mention some of the serious precautions Christians must take on the path of God's kingdom with reference to Luk 21:34 compare with Matt 24:38-39.
4. Highlight how best to deal with the virus of remiss in our Christian lives? 1Co 8:9-12; 1Tim 4:11-16.

CONCLUSION: Though an unpopular sinful habit, yet it poses threat on the path of PILGRIMS TO HEAVENLY KINGDOM. Let us all beware of all negligence to heavenly matters so as not to fail the test of the Lord's second coming.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT: Beware of Remiss; a hidden obstruction on the kingdom path.

It is not commanded by any decree of God that bishops, presbyters, or deacons take a vow of celibacy or abstain from marriage. So it is lawful for them, as for all other Christians, to marry at their own discretion when they judge that this will promote godliness

33. The Excommunicated: How they are to be Avoided.

Any person who has openly been denounced by the church and justly cut off from its fellowship and excommunicated is to be regarded by the whole body of the faithful as a 'pagan and swindler' until he is openly reconciled by repentance and received back into the church by a judge who has the necessary authority in such matters.

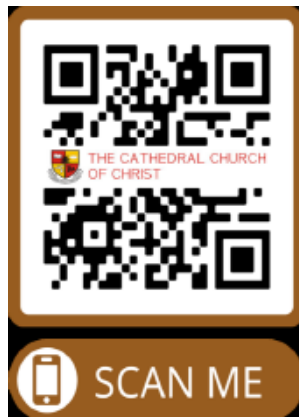

ACTIVATING POSSIBILITIES WITH (Vi) Christian Service

“Carry each other’s burdens, and in this way, you will fulfil the law of Christ.”- Galatians 6:2

After the Pentecost and Trinity break, we resume our series on ways to activate possibilities for mega miracles in our lives. The sixth topic in the series is Christian Service. Known also as Christian ministry or Christian service work, it refers to the act of serving others in accordance with the teachings and example of Jesus Christ. It is a fundamental aspect of the Christian faith and encompasses a wide range of activities and forms of service. In Isaiah 58, God addresses the people of Israel, specifically focusing on their religious practices and their treatment of others, and also in Matthew’s Gospel chapter 25:31ff, Jesus identifies Himself with those who are poor and excluded, the stranded stranger, those in prisons, and the marginals of the society, and teaches that we will be judged, not on how fervent we are in prayer or in other religious activities, but on the way that we treat others.

From Isaiah’s and Jesus’ standpoints, Christian Service can take the form of any of the following:

Acts of mercy and compassion: This involves showing kindness, empathy, and assistance to those who are suffering or in need, such as feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, caring for the sick, visiting the imprisoned, and providing shelter for the homeless.

Missionary work: spreading the teachings of Jesus and providing practical assistance to communities in need, both locally and globally. This can include evangelism, community development, education, healthcare, and humanitarian aid.

Church ministries: That is serving within their local church communities by volunteering in various ministries and roles, such as teaching, worship leading, youth work, counselling, hospitality, administration, and pastoral care.

Social justice and advocacy: Christians are called to work towards social justice and advocate for the rights and dignity of all individuals, particularly the marginalized and oppressed. This may involve addressing issues like poverty, inequality, discrimination, human trafficking, and environmental stewardship

Discipleship and mentoring: Christians are encouraged to disciple and mentor others, offering guidance, support, and spiritual formation to help individuals grow in their faith and become mature followers of Christ.

Praying for others: Prayer is considered a powerful form of Christian service. Christians can intercede on behalf of others, seeking God’s intervention, healing, comfort, and guidance.

Christian Service is not an optional extra but an essential component of faith. To serve others is to show them that we care i.e., giving our time and being there for them. There are many people who feel lonely and in need of true companionship. By providing love and support we can make a real difference in their lives. Paul reminds us that helping others when in difficult situations is fundamental to the gospel. *Carry each other’s burdens, and in this way, you will fulfil the law of Christ. (Galatians 6:2).* James said: *Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, ‘Go in peace; keep warm and well fed,’ but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself if it is not accompanied by action, is dead. (James 2:15-17).*

Christian Service goes beyond almsgiving as it is a deliberate and concerted effort to proffer solutions to the problems of our neighbour as demonstrated by God who deployed everything at His disposal to bring

the comfort of salvation to mankind. As Christians, we should be moved and inspired to love and be generous towards humanity. We cannot profess to love God, and not express that love practically to our neighbour. The point here is, the Christian life is one of service to others, where we show love and kindness to everyone, even to those who do not treat us well.

The Bible assures that when we live up to expectations in Christian Service, it says: *Then you will call, and the Lord will answer; you will cry for help, and he will say: Here am I. "If you do away with the yoke of oppression, with the pointing finger and malicious talk, and if you spend yourselves on behalf of the hungry and satisfy the needs of the oppressed, then your light will rise in the darkness, and your night will become like the noonday. The Lord will guide you always; he will satisfy your needs in a sun-scorched land and will strengthen your frame. You will be like a well-watered garden, like a spring whose waters never fail.* (Isaiah 58:9-11).

Herein lies all the possibilities for mega miracles!
